

SENATE BILL S03-09

July 28, 2003

- TITLE:** Amending Senate Bill 84-09 as Previously Amended by Senate Bills 86-13, 94-15, and 97-11
- WHEREAS:** The Graduate and Professional Student Senate seeks to allocate funds to graduate and professional student organizations in order to enhance the education experience of students at ISU, and
- WHEREAS:** Some student organizations have difficulty meeting the fall allocation deadline, especially if the organization has elected a new president or treasurer, and
- WHEREAS:** Some organizations are more active in the fall or spring semester, so it would be beneficial for these organizations to receive all funds allocated by GPSS in that semester, and
- WHEREAS:** Reducing allocations for organizations from twice per academic year to once per academic year reduces the number of forms that an organization needs to fill out, be it therefore
- ENACTED:** That Article IV, Section C of GSS Bill 84-09 be amended to state: “All organizations may file completed applications once per academic year. Organizations choosing to file in the fall semester must submit completed applications by 5:00 P.M. on the first Friday in October. Applications will be reviewed following the October deadline and acted on by the GPSS in October. If more than five percent (5%) of the group allocation fund remains after the October allocation, there will be a second allocation period. Organizations choosing to file in the spring semester must submit completed applications by 5:00 P.M. on the first Friday in March. Applications will be reviewed after the March deadline and acted on by the GPSS in March. Organizations may only apply for allocation funds once per academic year.”, and be it further
- ENACTED:** That Article V, Section A 2 be amended to read, “No organization may receive more than \$800.00. As stated in Senate Bill 94-09, SCAVMA, being the only Veterinary Medicine student organization that may apply for GPSS funding, has a maximum level of funding not more than five times the maximum allotment.”
